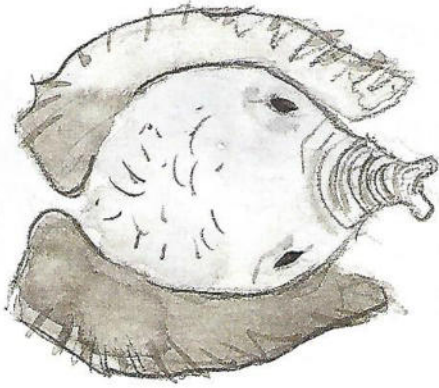

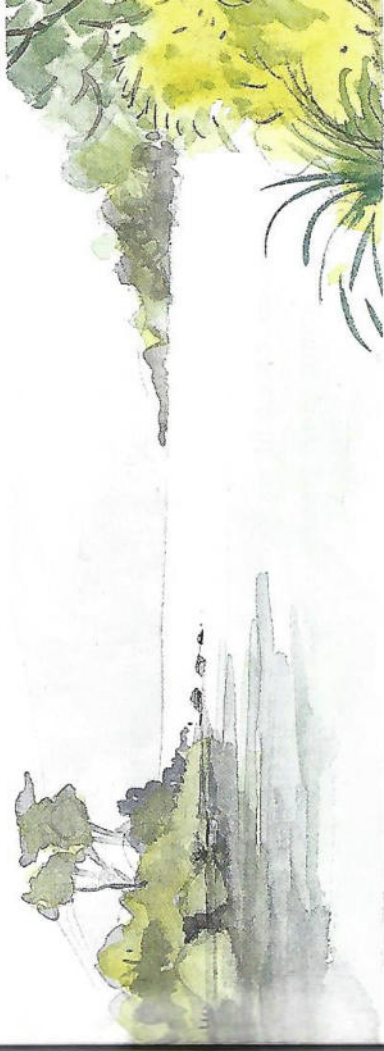

In English most adjectives go before the noun: *The great, grey, green Limpopo River*

In this sentence the order of the adjectives is:

Size	Colour	Colour	Noun
(The) great	grey	green	Limpopo River

But be careful, adjectives usually go after the following verbs: be, seem, look, become: *The python was angry.*
